# Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner (ARNP) LICENSE RENEWAL INSTRUCTIONS

The ARNP license renewal application can be started online, including payment of fees. Renewal is available no sooner than 60 days prior to expiration.

The fee is \$81.00 for each ARNP specialty area. If applicable, you will complete a separate application for each specialty.

Step 1: First, make sure the underlying RN license is renewed.

- For lowa residents or residents of noncompact states that means completing the renewal of the lowa RN license, before proceeding to the ARNP.
- Residents of compact states must first renew their RN license in their primary state of residence.

**Step 2**: Next, go to "IBON Online Services" and select the option to "Renew an Existing License." (If this is your first visit to the site you will be required to create an account.) Follow through to the end of the process, making sure to click "Complete the Application" after payment has been made, and then click "Continue" one more time to access final instructions.

## **Step 3**: Submit the required documentation:

- A copy of your current certification card from the applicable national certifying body.
- Residents of compact states must submit documentation that the RN license in the state of residence has been renewed.

Any one of the following is deemed acceptable:

- A copy of an active RN license in the compact state that includes an expiration date and the multistate status of the compact license
- Copy of an online verification from the website of the other compact state
- Copy of the verification printed from <u>www.nursys.com</u>, "QuickConfirm"
- Some states only issue an ARNP registration or a dual license. If your primary state of residence issues this type of card, either would be acceptable.

The renewal cannot be completed by office staff until all the required documentation has been received. This can be submitted by any of the following methods:

## **Continuing Education Requirement**

The continuing education required by the national certifying body is deemed to meet the continuing education requirement mandated by Iowa law for license renewal. Documentation of current certification in itself verifies compliance.

The ARNP certification also meets the continuing education requirement for renewal of an RN license. If selected for a random audit of continuing education when renewing your RN license, you may submit an additional copy of the current national certification card as evidence of compliance with the continuing education requirement.

Additionally, ARNPs who regularly examine, attend, counsel or treat children or adults in lowa are required to complete training related to the identification and reporting of child/dependent adult abuse. Any ARNP performing direct hands-on care of any kind is deemed to be a mandatory reporter, and must complete two hours of training every five years, and must submit documentation if the RN license is selected for audit. See the Mandatory Reporter Training requirements at nursing.iowa.gov.

Upon renewal of licensure, ARNPs who perform fluoroscopy procedures need proof of continuing education. More information can be found at nursing.iowa.gov.

### **Nurse Practice Act**

Registered nurses are accountable for the practice of nursing in accordance with current lowa laws and administrative rules. A nurse practicing under the nurse licensure compact must comply with the state practice laws of the state in which the patient is located at the time care is rendered.
