STATEMENT OF CHARGES, CONSENT

AGREEMENT, AND ORDER

Respondent.

The Iowa Engineering and Land Surveying Examining Board ("Board") and Todd Jeffrey Reyling ("Respondent") enter into this Statement of Charges, Consent Agreement, and Order ("Agreement") pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.10(1), 272C.3(4)(a) (2021), and Iowa Administrative Code r. 193—7.42:

A. Legal Authority and Jurisdiction.

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code chapters 17A, 272C, and 542B.
- 2. The Board has authority to take disciplinary action against Respondent under Iowa Code chapters 272C and 542B, and Iowa Administrative Code rule 193C—9.3.

B. Facts.

- 3. Respondent is a licensed professional engineer in Iowa. The Board issued Respondent his license as a professional engineer on September 15, 2017.
- 4. On April 30, 2018, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions took a disciplinary action against Respondent, resulting in a fine of \$5,000 and \$6,500 for Board costs and expenses.
- 5. On July 30, 2018, the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation took disciplinary action against Respondent, resulting in a five-year probation and a fine of \$5,000.

- 6. On July 18, 2019, the Missouri Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Professional Land Surveyors, and Professional Landscape Architects, took disciplinary action against the Respondent, imposing a four-year probation to run concurrently with Respondent's Illinois probation, along with other requirements.
- 7. On September 24, 2019, the Minnesota Board of Architecture, Engineering, Land Surveying, Landscape Architecture, Geoscience and Interior Design took disciplinary action against the Respondent, resulting in a suspension and a \$2,000 fine.
- 8. On July 16, 2020 the Indiana Board of Registration for Professional Engineers took disciplinary action against the Respondent, resulting in an imposition of probation with the ability to petition to remove probation status once Respondent completed the Illinois probation.
- 9. On November 27, 2020, the Ohio State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors took disciplinary action against Respondent, resulting in a reprimand, a fine of \$1,000, a six month suspension, probation, and additional required hours of professional development in professional ethics.
- 10. Respondent admitted to receiving the Illinois disciplinary action when he renewed his Iowa license on November 16, 2020.
- 11. In all cases, Respondent failed to report the disciplinary action to the Board within thirty days of the disciplinary action becoming final.

C. Charges.

16. Respondent committed six (6) counts failing to notify the Board of disciplinary action by a licensing authority of another state within thirty days of the disciplinary action in violation of Iowa Administrative Code r. 193C—9.3(6).

D. Consent Agreement

17. Respondent has a right to a hearing on the charges but waives Respondent's right to hearing and all attendant rights, including the right to seek judicial review, by freely and voluntarily entering into this Agreement. This Agreement constitutes discipline against Respondent and is the final agency order in the contested case, pursuant to Iowa Code section 17A.10 and Iowa Administrative Code rule 193—7.42. Respondent acknowledges that Respondent had an opportunity to review this Agreement with legal counsel before signing it.

- 18. Respondent agrees the State's counsel may present this Agreement to the Board and may have ex parte communications with the Board while presenting it.
- 19. This Agreement shall be part of the permanent record of Respondent and shall be considered by the Board in determining the nature and severity of any future disciplinary action to be imposed in the event of any future violations.
- 20. This Agreement is a public record available for inspection and copying in accordance with the requirements of Iowa Code chapter 22.
- 21. Failure to comply with the provisions of this Agreement shall be grounds for further disciplinary action pursuant to Iowa Code section 272C.3(2)(a). However, no action may be taken against Respondent for violations of these provisions without a hearing or waiver of hearing.
 - 22. This Agreement is subject to approval of the Board:
- a. If the Board fails to approve this Agreement, it shall be of no force or effect on either party, and it shall not be admissible for any purpose in further proceedings in this matter;
 - b. If the Board approves this Agreement, it shall fully dispose of all issues in this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. <u>Probation</u>. Respondent's license as an Iowa professional engineer is placed on probation beginning on the date this agreement is signed by both parties and ending on August 31, 2023. *See* Iowa Admin Code r. 193C—9.4(6). Respondent is directed to adhere to all applicable statutes and administrative rules in the practice of professional engineering, including the requirement that Respondent notify the Board within 30 days of any future disciplinary action in another jurisdiction and that any future disciplinary action is disclosed during license renewal.
