I write to support the proposed amendment to Chapter 4, "Pharmacist-Interns," Iowa Administrative Code. The change to accept either a social security number or an individual tax identification number (ITIN) will make it possible for students that are not citizens to more readily obtain the intern license which is required to participate in our program. It will also allow them to gain employment as a technician/intern. These students all pay out of state tuition and have previously been limited to jobs on campus in non-pharmacy related part-time positions. This will help them earn money and gain valuable experience, but it will also provide Iowa pharmacies with a larger pool of student pharmacists. There will also be some tax benefits to the state.
