Sec. 1. NEW SECTION. 155A.47 Collaborative pharmacy practice

1. For the purposes of this section:

a. "Collaborative pharmacy practice" means a practice of pharmacy whereby a pharmacist provides patient care and drug therapy management services, not otherwise permitted to be performed by a pharmacist, to patients under a collaborative pharmacy practice agreement.

b. "Collaborative pharmacy practice agreement" means a written agreement between one or more pharmacists and one or more physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or dentist that provides for a collaborative pharmacy practice and defines the nature, scope, conditions, and limitations of the patient care and drug therapy management services to be provided by a pharmacist.

2. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, a pharmacist may engage in a collaborative pharmacy practice, in accordance with rules adopted by the board pursuant to chapter 17A and under a collaborative pharmacy practice agreement, to provide patient care and drug therapy management services to a patient.

Sec. 2. Section 155A.46, subsection 1, paragraph "d", Code 2019 is amended to read as follows:

d. Prior to the ordering and administration of a vaccination or immunization authorized by this subsection for patients <u>under the age of 18</u>, pursuant to statewide protocols, a licensed pharmacist shall consult and review the statewide immunization registry or health information network. The board shall adopt rules requiring the reporting of the administration of vaccines and immunizations authorized by this subsection to a patient's primary health care provider, primary physician, and a statewide immunization network.
