Prevent & Control Diabetes in Iowans: A Call to Action!

In July 2015, I was afforded the opportunity to begin a two-year Public Health Nurse Leadership program with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. This opportunity aligned me with the Iowa Action Coalition to develop initiative focused on a local problem to drive towards a Culture of Health. For decades I've observed diabetes slowly rob the health of family members, friends,



and patients. Not surprisingly, I instantly felt compelled to address the diabetes epidemic our nation, and more specifically lowa, is facing.

The diabetes rates in the United States (U.S.) are approaching epidemic proportions. The number of adults diagnosed with diabetes has more than tripled over the past three decades. There are now 29.1 million people diagnosed with diabetes and an estimated 8.1 million people undiagnosed.1 To compound matters, there is an alarming increase of persons at risk for developing diabetes. The CDC estimates 86 million Americans (1 out of 3 adults) have prediabetes.² That's almost 800,000 lowans and 90% of these individuals are unaware of their diagnosis.

The Culture of Health initiative I set forth to accomplish was a perfect opportunity to bring key partners and stakeholders together in a concerted effort to engage communities across lowa in increasing clinical outcomes and preventing the onset of type 2 diabetes.

This was part of a much larger plan to advance diabetes prevention and control throughout Iowa. This initiative aligned with several tactics listed within the Iowa Statewide Diabetes Strategic plan: https://idph. iowa.gov/Portals/1/userfiles/71/Iowa%20Diabetes%20 Statewide%20Strategic%20Plan.pdf.

An Iowa Diabetes Prevention and Control Planning Committee was developed in April 2016. Partners included the Iowa Action Coalition, the American Diabetes Association, the Iowa Healthcare Collaborative, the Iowa Department of Public Health, the Iowa Alliance of YMCA and the Midwestern Public Health Training Center. This interdisciplinary team set out to better understand the current diabetes prevention and control climate in Iowa and convened additional stakeholders across the state to share the findings and develop strategies in addressing lowa's current gaps and barriers in delivering services.

A statewide diabetes prevention and diabetes selfmanagement education services survey was conducted in the fall of 2016. Goals of the survey were twofold. First, the survey identified current gaps and barriers in offering diabetes prevention program (DPP) services and diabetes self-management education (DSME) services for patients within the healthcare setting. Seeking this information helped clarify the causes for the lack of

Nurses are busy people! I believe this to be a fact. Not only are nurses busy working within the nursing profession, but they also have busy lives outside of their work environment. Though, as a nursing professional there are rules and regulations all nurses must follow to retain their license.

I would like to remind all nurses of some key requirements and suggestions in retaining your license and pose some questions relating to meeting those requirements. Please note this list is not all inclusive.

- Routinely check your wallet card or the Online Verification System to determine your license expiration date.
- A licensee may renew a license beginning 60 days prior to the license expiration date on the wallet card.
- At the time of renewal make sure you have completed your continuing education requirements.
- For renewal of a three year license, the requirement is 36 contact hours or 3.6 CEUs.
- For renewal of a license that has been issued for less than three years, the requirement is 24

A Note From the Chairperson - Gwen Suntken

This is not new information Iowa Nurses, but I wanted to remind all nurses and employers of the new alternative to discipline program for impaired nurses in Iowa. The Iowa Nurse Assistance Program (INAP) is a **confidential** monitoring program for nurses who voluntarily inform the Board of Nursing that they have an issue with alcohol, drug



use, or with any mental or physical condition. Nurses

can self-report, or be referred to the INAP program, to determine whether or not the nurse would benefit. INAP is managed by a program coordinator and a committee to assist nurses in the early identification and treatment of impairment and illness. An individualized contract will be designed to allow the nurse to return to practice or to continue to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety. Nurses would have to voluntarily enter the program, and comply with all terms of their legally binding contract or they will be terminated from the INAP Program. This program provides public protection through close monitoring to ensure safe nursing practice. The goal of the Iowa Board of Nursing is to assure safe nursing care in lowa. What?



What is the Iowa Nurse Assistance Program (INAP)?

INAP is a new resource for individual nurses who are impaired as a result of alcohol or drug use, dependency, addiction, or by any mental or physical condition.

It is a voluntary, confidential program and provides an opportunity for licensed professionals to receive proper treatment and maintain their professional status, while protecting the safety of the public.

Are programs like this successful?

Yes! Similar programs to INAP currently in practice show that an appropriate combination of treatment and support effectively help participants manage their impairment or condition.



Who may be eligible for the program?

- Nurses who voluntarily report themselves
- Nurses with any physical or mental condition
- Nurses who use alcohol or drugs to the extent

Referrals may come from:

affecting their practice

- Self-referra
- Licensure department
- Enforcement
- Employer complaints



Impairment can cost your job and license.

INAP Serves Nurses:

- · Consultation upon entering program
- Early intervention and treatment referrals to local support services
- Ongoing monitoring and support as an effective alternative to discipline

INAP Serves the Public:

- Public protection through close monitoring to ensure safe practice

ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

INAP Update

The Iowa Nurse Assistance Program (INAP) was launched on December 23, 2016, and began accepting participants into the program. As of March 2017, the program is processing 37 licensees. To be considered for the program, licensees must complete a self-report form and meet criteria. You may access self-report forms on the Iowa Board of Nursing website under the Iowa Nurse Assistance Program tab. Since program initiation some commonly asked questions have emerged and they are addressed below:

1) What is the cost of the program?

There is no administrative charge for the services provided by the INAP. However, any costs incurred through participation in the INAP is the responsibility of the participant. Expenses include, but may not be limited to treatment, evaluation and random body fluid screenings.

2) If I enter the Program, will anyone find out?

Involvement in INAP is confidential. Information cannot be released without the licensee's authorization, unless provision of information is required by law. As long as the nurse cooperates with the program, his or her name will not be shared with the Board of Nursing.

3) How long does the program last?

The program requires commitment and licensees need to sign a three year contract for INAP.

Who Runs INAP?

The Iowa Nurse Assistance Program (INAP) is authorized by the Iowa Board of Nursing to assist nurses in the early identification and treatment of impairment and illness. INAP is managed by a committee who works with the program coordinator. Committee members include the director of the Iowa Board of Nursing, substance and mental health professionals, nurses recovering from addiction, and a public member.

The INAP committee may:

- 1) Evaluate on a case by case basis whether candidates are appropriate for the program.
- 2) Submit recommendations to the lowa Board of Nursing.
- 3) Monitor the recovery process of participants.

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New LPN Supervisory Course Launched

The lowa Board of Nursing, in February, announced the approval of a new curriculum for the Supervisory Course for lowa's Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN), offered by the National Healthcare Institute (NHI), IBON approved provider 376. The new course is a completely online course with access to an electronic textbook titled, *Leading and Managing in Nursing*.

NHI launched the curriculum on February 1, 2017. Direct access to the course's description and registration page can be found at https://www.celearningnetwork.com/individual-ce-courses/state-required-courses/supervisory-course-for-iowa-s-licensed-practical-nurses.html. Licensees will be sent a detailed registration letter and course navigation guide upon payment for the course. In order to allow existing or already-planned courses to finish, discontinuance of the old LPN courses offered by lowa's community college continuing education departments is set for July 1, 2017. As of July 1st, the NHI course will be the only source for offering the new LPN Supervisory course in lowa.

The Board and staff are pleased to offer this updated curriculum and course to lowa's LPNs. The online delivery of the materials will provide timely, accessible training. LPNs will be able to meet the legal requirement of obtaining their training within six

months of beginning their duties as supervisors in lowa's healthcare facilities.

The benefits of the online LPN Supervisory Course are:

- an online course is desired by the licensees;
- the content is up-to-date and reviewed with new editions of the textbook;
- the course will be accessible on the student's timeline and work schedule;
- the course is self-paced;
- the delivery of the course will be interactive and supply additional resource links for the student;
- the course is priced at \$195 per student;
- an electronic textbook is issued to the student and owned by the student upon registration for the course; the book access never expires;
- 24 hour IT support is available;
- faculty is readily available for the students via email;
- licensees should be able to finish the Board's requirements of completing coursework within six months of hire as a supervisor, reducing the number of waiver requests submitted to board staff;
- a certificate of completion will be issued for the licensee's records;
- licensees will earn 30 contact hours of nursing CE toward their licensure renewal requirements of 36 contact hours;
- NHI will also notify the IBON of course completion for inclusion in the licensee's records with the Board.



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

Fluoroscopy Audit Reminder

The administrative rules governing nursing in lowa require Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners (ARNPs) who supervise the use of fluoroscopic x-ray equipment to have the appropriate education and continued annual radiological safety updates. Pursuant to 7.2(d), the initial and annual education requirements are subject to audit by the Board. Therefore, the Board of Nursing will be auditing ARNP's who supervise fluoroscopy.

The initiation of the audit process began January 12, 2015. The process is as follows:

- On the ARNP online and paper renewal application a question will be asked
 if the practitioner provides direct supervision in the use of fluoroscopy. The
 renewal process is every three years,
- If the practitioner answers yes, they will be required to provide verification of
 completion of the initial course and yearly safety courses, along with a copy of
 the course description and learning outcomes (it is important to submit
 the specific course description and learning outcomes and not just the
 course title),
- Board staff will contact the practitioner if there are any questions about the submitted course work or if the practitioner has not completed their required education,
- At any point in time that board staff identifies the ARNP is not complying with the course requirements and the audit process the information will be submitted to the Enforcement Unit.

The Iowa Board of Nursing recognizes this is a new process for all ARNP's supervising the use of fluoroscopic x-ray equipment. Board staff is committed to assist practitioners in the audit process. 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Creating an Online User Account

If you have ever done business online with any state agency (such as for college aid), you would use the same account id that you have already created. Otherwise, all license related processes begin with user registration, including updating contact, employment or educational information. Secured Access and ordering a roster also require the visitor to register.

The main menu displays the following option:



If you click on "Create a New Account," you will be taken directly to the registration page and tab that you need in order to register:



This registration site is maintained by the state's technology division as a global login for the entire state enterprise.

Enter your first and last name:



The registration automatically combines first and last names into a suggested user i.d., and appends "@iowaid." But if the first name/last name combination already exists, the i.d. field will appear blank, and you will need to create your own account i.d. In either case, anything can be substituted ahead of the "@", but the i.d. that is created is permanent so it will need to be memorable.




Enter your email address twice in the screen pictured above, and click "Save Account Details." A popup box gives a final caution.



If you created an i.d. with your first name.lastname as your i.d., and someone else with the same first and last name has already registered to do any kind of business with the State of Iowa, you will receive the following error message.



After successfully selecting an i.d., entering the email address twice and clicking "continue," you will see the following screen advising you that an email has been sent with information to complete the registration. Note that there is a time limit of 48 hours to complete the registration.



The email will include a link to come back to the registration site. This is done as verification that the email address is a real one. Clicking the link in the email returns the user to the following screen at the EAA website to complete the registration by selecting security questions and answers.



The next screen requires the user to create their password:



The registration is complete, and the user is taken to the screen where they can actually log in. Note that the above registration process should only be required once. Thereafter, the licensee would use the existing account.

Also note that on most screens there is a "Help" button. This will take you to a help library maintained by the state's Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO), and may take you to the relevant portion of an extended FAQ system.

It is only on the login screen itself, that you will find a link to report an issue to the OCIO Help Desk.



This link will take you into the state's OCIO site to submit a service request or inquiry.

TO CHANGE YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS

If your email address changes, it needs to be updated in two different places: your IBON record, and your login account. These are hosted separately.

To update your IBON record:

Although you can wait until you renew your license, it may be wiser to update it immediately, as follows:

- 1. Go to IBON Online Services and select "Update Contact Information."
- 2. This will take you to the Enterprise login screen mandated by the State of Iowa.
- 3. Enter your account i.d. and password, and click "Sign In."
- 4. You will be returned to the lowa Board of Nursing Online Services, and the proper screen to update your information.
- Update all available fields on the screen

 including your email address, and click
 Continue.

To Update your login i.d.

Your login email is different from the email address in your license record. The login email is used by the state's mandated authentication services for all state business. If you forget your login i.d, the system can send it to you – but it will go to the email address they have on record in the login account, not to the address in your license record.

- 1. Go to IBON Online Services and select "Update Contact Information." This will take you to the Enterprise login screen mandated by the State of Iowa.
- On the login screen (below), enter your account i.d. and password, BUT <u>instead of clicking on</u> "Sign In," click on "Account Details."



3. This will take you to the following screen, where it is apparent that you need to enter your new email twice and click save.

Additional note:

If you can remember neither your login i.d. nor your password, AND your email address has changed, you have two choices:

- Create an new and different login i.d. and password. The new login i.d. must be different from the one you initially created, i.e., <u>Suzy.</u> <u>Smith@iowaid</u> could become <u>Suzy.Smith2@iowaid</u>.
- 2. You can request assistance through the state's Help Desk from the links available in the lower right of the login screen, or by calling 515-281-5703, or 1-800-532-1174.

Renewal Reminder

Licensees should plan to renew their nursing license 30 to 60 days prior the expiration date. A nursing license may be renewed until midnight of the expiration date without penalty, but this practice is discouraged. Online system problems can occur and late fees will be assessed for any renewal completed after midnight of the expiration date.

A \$50 late fee is required for licensees who renew within the 30 days after the license lapses. Licenses that are not renewed will automatically be placed on inactive status on the 16th of the month following the expiration date of the license

The continuing education requirement for license renewal is 36 contact hours (3.6 CEUs) for the renewal of a full three year license. Licensees renewing for the first time after the license was originally issued, or for the first time after a reactivation, will need 24 contact hours (2.4 CEUs) completed after the effective date printed on the license wallet card. Before you renew, you should have your documentation in-hand to confirm you have what you need. As soon as you renew, you will know if you have been chosen for audit. Remember, if it is not documented – it is not done!

Nurses Rank #1 Most Trusted Profession for 15th Year in a Row



SILVER SPRING, MD – The American public has again ranked nurses as the professionals with the highest honesty and ethical standards, according to a Gallup poll released December 19. The annual poll marks the 15th consecutive year that nurses have been ranked the most trusted out of a wide spectrum of professions, including medical doctors and police officers.

"Every day, millions of nurses are on the front lines in the fight to improve the health of all Americans," said

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

Pamela F. Cipriano, PhD, RN, NEA-BC, FAAN, president of the American Nurses Association. "Whether nurses are by the bedside or in the board room, we continue to be a trusted resource and a vital part of our nation's health care system. This poll reflects the trust the public has in us, and we'll continue to work hard to keep that trust."

According to the poll, 84 percent of Americans rated nurses' honesty and ethical standards as "very high" or "high." The next closest profession, pharmacists, was rated 17 percentage points behind nursing.

"Trust plays an important role in the relationship between nurses and the patients we serve," said Cipriano. "ANA encourages nurses to draw on that trust to engage with consumers to improve their health and to advocate for patients and for the quality of care in this country. Additionally, I challenge those charged with making health policy at the facility, local, state and national levels, to include the trusted voice of nurses at the decision-making table. No other profession is held in as high regard by the public, and given nursing's frontline perspective on health care delivery we offer a point of view that is unmatched."

In 2017, ANA will continue its longstanding efforts to advocate for health system reform. The association is committed to working with the new administration and Congress to advance policy that aligns with its four principles for health system reform: access to care, affordable and equitable care, quality of care and workforce.

- contact hours or 2.4 CEUs. (The two year license only occurs in the first license renewal cycle.)
- 6. Maintain records of the continuing education you have received in your licensing cycle.
- 7. If you are chosen for a random audit of your continuing education, complete the audit following the directions.
- 8. Do you regularly examine, attend, counsel or treat dependent adults or children in lowa? If the answer is yes, have you completed the Mandatory Training course for dependent adults and children within the last 5 years? This course must be completed every 5 years.
- At the time of initial licensure or renewal answer all questions honestly, specifically relating to your continuing education and criminal history.
- Does the board office have your current address on file? If not, submit your current address online at <u>nursing.iowa.gov</u>, select IBON Online Services, or in writing to the board office

- or submit by email. (This should occur within 30 days of your move.)
- 11. Do you know the address for the Iowa Board of Nursing's website? https://nursing.iowa.gov. Mark it as a favorite and refer to it often!
- 12. Do you know where to find the lowa Administrative Rules for nursing, 655IAC?
- 13. Do you know who your legislator is?
- 14. Have you explored the option of joining a professional nursing organization and asked yourself how you can become involved in your profession?
- 15. Board staff is here to help answer your questions it is always better to ask than to assume you have the correct answer. The main number to the board office is 515-281-3255.

Specific to the Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner (ARNP):

1. ARNPs must hold an active RN license and an active certification throughout the license period.

- For an lowa ARNP license you must submit a copy of your current certification card from the applicable national certifying body and documentation of your RN license if from another compact state.
- 3. The continuing education required by the national certifying body is deemed to meet the continuing education requirement mandated by law for license renewal. Documentation of current certification in itself verifies compliance.
- 4. ARNP's who regularly examine, attend, counsel or treat children or adults in lowa are required to complete the Mandatory Training course for dependent adults and children every 5 years.

In summary, nurses are busy, but you are accountable and responsible to follow the rules and regulations which govern your licensure and practice. I encourage you to stay informed and to follow the steps necessary to continue your nursing practice.

current local DPP and DSME services and/or patient utilization of services within their practice. Second, the survey identified gaps and barriers within current or potential diabetes prevention providers while getting a better understanding of the existing DPP infrastructure within lowa. Information gained from the surveys framed discussion at a statewide summit.

In November 2016, the Region VII Diabetes Summit was held in Des Moines, Iowa. This inaugural summit begins the holding of annual diabetes prevention and control summits in Iowa. A Lifestyle Coach training opportunity was provided on days one and two by the American Diabetes Association, resulting in the addition of 20 new lifestyle coaches to provide DPP services in Iowa. On day three, speakers from the Region VII U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Diabetes Association presented information on diabetes prevention and diabetes self-management education programming. Summit participants then focused on identifying strategies to address the barriers identified from the gap analysis findings.

Much has been accomplished since the inception of this project and additional work will continue. An lowa Diabetes Prevention and Self-Management Education Services 2016 Gap Analysis & Improvement Strategies report was developed and can be accessed on the lowa Action Coalition's website at http://campaignforaction.org/state/iowa. A follow up survey will go out to the Region VII Diabetes Summit participants in May 2017, to assess how the information learned at the event impacted their programming. In addition, in May 2017, a State Engagement Meeting with the National Association of Chronic Disease Directors is scheduled. Invited stakeholders will convene to further address diabetes prevention programming through development of an action plan to assist communities with further progress of diabetes prevention services.

In closing, I would like stress how much of a pivotal role nurses play in impacting the course of the diabetes epidemic. Nursing continues to be ranked the most trusted profession in America. We have the privilege to be able to reach out to our patients with education and encouragement for participation in these needed services. We have strong leadership skills and should

be at the forefront in advocating for development and utilization of services that make our communities healthier. Lastly, it's essential that we step outside our comfort zone and engage with non-traditional partners in order to succeed in building a Culture of Health and keep it sustainable.









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CE Credits Now Available in Minutes at a Time on Smartphone App

A first-of-its-kind app created in Eastern Iowa is allowing the more than 3.1 million registered nurses across the United States the ability to earn continuing education credits on their smartphones in minutes at a time versus hours at a time - saving both time and money.

The CEHQ (Continuing Education Headquarters) app frees nurses from the traditional online or classroom credit renewal methods - currently the most common ways for nurses to earn continuing education (CE) credits. 

"We recognized the need to simplify the process by which nurses earn their continuing education. As a result, we created an easy-to-use, on-thego mobile app that allows them to gain access to healthrelated research, programs, and certificates of completion, all while earning credits for their CEUs. With CEHQ, nurses can now get their credits while walking down the clinic or hospital halls or while waiting to pick up their children, learning what they need to that day."

CEHQ provides content from a database of unbiased, trusted medical sources compiled by the University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine. Sources include Elsevier, the National Library of Medicine, Centers for Disease Control, National Institutes of Health, and other academic and governmental sources.

"The response from nurses across the country has been overwhelming," says Ainger. "They are thankful to have a tool that breaks their CEUs into short chunks that they can tackle while treating patients, during their commute, or over a lunch break."
